Shoe Box Story.....

Karabo is a young man from Lesotho, a kingdom in southern Africa. By the time he was 11, he had lost both parents as well as his grandmother, who had taught him about God's love. He felt sad and lonely until he heard the Gospel at a church that was handing out shoebox gifts. Years later, he still carries a comb that was in his shoebox. "It is a reminder that God knows my needs, even the little



things that can bring joy," he said. "God used the shoebox to give me hope and to fill my brokenness. I had a desire to know Him more, and I surrendered my life to Him. Today, I have eternal life in Christ because of His love for me."

Since 1993 Samaritan's Purse has delivered 178 million shoebox gifts in 170 countries and territories, along with the materials for The Greatest Journey classes. The Lord has used this to bring more than 11.5 million boys and girls to faith in Christ.





FLANNERY FAMILY UPDATE

Gearing up for fall!

It seems just unbelievable that we are about to enter October 2020! August and September have just flown by. August

brought unexpected time to attend a family wedding, visit quickly through North Carolina at churches and with friends as well as a family vacation with David's family. September



has been filled with virtual meeting both for America and Italy, starting homeschool kindergarten with Kaleb and many Medical appointments.





We were able to attend a family wedding and Kaleb kept talking about the princess and how pretty she was!

Many of you may be wondering why we are still in America! It's a question we have asked ourselves frequently to be honest. A general update is that throughout our summer, David has experienced increasing amounts of joint pain and stiffness. We attributed it to intense work out programs, old mattress, etc. but it continued to worsen inexplicably. After visiting with a doctor and running tests, it became clear that he had severe inflammation throughout his body. Few additional doctor visits with specialists have determined he has an autoimmune disease.

Likely he has had it for over a decade but it had been misdiagnosed. Fortunately through lifestyle changes, starting medication and great support through family and doctors, he has been making improvements! The progress is expected to be slow but we have great hope he will return to his normal active and energetic self in a few months! That all being said, we've been delayed from returning to Italy for this medical reason. There is great rheumatological care in Milan via Zoom so the transition back will hopefully be smooth! As such, we are hoping to return soon to Italy.

Both Kaleb and Jackson are doing very well. Jackson has started potty training and we have learned that he can decide which days/moods he wants to be potty trained. Kaleb misses his George greatly but has been doing extremely well with his homeschool program! Kaleb turned 5 this past week which is simply unbelievable. We celebrated with local family through a dinosaur themed party. He had also started playing T-Ball and our Saturday morning games are quite entertaining at this age! Danielle has resumed Italian driving school virtually and we have been in communication with potential church partnerships in Milan to begin upon our return.

We are doing well and seeing physical improvements. We feel blessed by this unexpected bonus time with family, nevertheless, we also long to return to our home in Milan! Lottie Moon



But in her time, Lottie was anything but an untouchable hero. In fact, she was like today's missionaries. She labored tirelessly so her people group could know Jesus.

Well over 100 years ago, a single missionary named Lottie Moon, while serving in China, began writing letters challenging the American church to send and support more workers to go there. After her death on the field, her challenge was heeded in the formalization of an offering in her name. Even if you're not a Southern Baptist who has given to the Lottie Moon Christmas Offering, her life is a reminder of why we must give to send and support missionaries serving among unreached peoples in unreached places.
